

**2021 AIS Cost-Share Grant Program - Ranking Guidelines**

Consider the ranking criteria below when designing your project and when completing your application. AIS Volunteer Incentive grants will not compete against Management Planning and AIS Control cost-share grant categories.

		50%	<b>AIS Volunteer Engagement - County Relevance</b> Preference will be given for projects developing a resource for county-wide use or engaging volunteers on a multi-lake scale.
10%	<b>Community Involvement</b> Project includes aspects to increase community capacity <i>Lake resident survey</i> <i>Initiatives for lake community education</i> Partnership included within project <i>Partner organization is donating time / funds</i>		
25%	<b>AIS Management</b> AIS management is consistent with management plan / DNR guidance <i>Proposal has clearly defined goals, follows recommended guidance</i> <i>AIS is targeted strategically (dense colonies, public access, etc.)</i> <i>Integrated management (multiple AIS removal techniques used)</i>		
25%	<b>Feasibility of Project</b> Project is reasonable and has a good chance of success. <i>Methods and acceptable timeline are outlined</i> <i>Program budget is defined and reasonable</i>		
10%	<b>Volunteer Involvement</b> Project sponsor is involved in one or more volunteer programs <i>County-based AIS monitoring programs</i> <i>Sponsor-based AIS or lake monitoring program</i> <i>MN DNR AIS Volunteer program</i> <i>MPCA's Volunteer water quality monitoring program</i> <i>Participation in regional / statewide lake networking group (COLA)</i>		
10%	<b>Priority Project Status</b> Project is for a "new" AIS threat to Sherburne County waters <i>New occurrence of a MN Prohibited Species in County</i> <i>Pioneer infestation to a lake (new AIS introduction)</i>
